Arialink Broadband to Bring Wireless to Muskegon County

Lansing, Mich.—In a joint effort with Muskegon County and Michigan Broadband Development Authority (MBDA), Arialink has been selected for a project to narrow the digital divide and bring wireless Internet to five low-to-moderate income communities in Muskegon County, making it the first county in the nation to provide high speed Internet service through a broadband grant program.

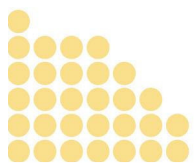
Arialink received \$2.2 million in federal grant money and was approved for a loan in the amount \$2.1 million to invest in the project that will provide high-speed, wireless Internet to Cedar Creek, Egelston, Holton and Moorland townships and the village of Lakewood Club in Muskegon County by the fall of 2006. Arialink was chosen by Muskegon County and MBDA out of five technology companies that competed for the grant.

The countywide wireless system will be affordable to residents who currently have Verizon and Comcast as Internet providers in the area. Rapid deployment of the system will begin in the five targeted communities and then the entire county. Arialink will use 16 towers to cover the county and 110 microcell stations that will be used to enhance coverage. The project includes bringing in 1,000 megabytes of fiber to provide a fast, high-speed connection.

Arialink will hire approximately 12 employees for the project in positions that include technical support and sales representatives for the Muskegon office location.
